**2) Challenges to Increasing Small Business Participation**

Federal construction contractors of all sizes, but especially small businesses, are facing new and onerous requirements that make it increasingly costly and risky to perform federal work. In recent years federal small businesses have had to comply, or need to comply, with a host of costly regulations and reporting requirements that will add expenses and risks to being a federal contractor. A few of these new requirements include: Cybersecurity (such as, Sec. 889B, NIST 800-171, or CMMC); Greenhouse Gas Reporting Requirements; Increased domestic content requirements for construction materials; COVID-19 vaccination requirements (recently withdrawn after two years); and Project Labor Agreement

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requirements.

The Administration has a number of initiatives to increase small business participation, such as increasing the share of contracts going to small disadvantaged businesses (SDB) by 50 percent by 2026, and increasing the small business goal for SDB federal contracts will increase from 5% to 7.5%. Federal agencies and contractors routinely strive to exceed the small business goals. Likewise, AGC has seen many small businesses exit the federal market, or more commonly beginning to diversify away from only performing federal work.
